

**SUBJECT:** Hampton-Newport News Criminal Justice Agency Briefing

As a follow-up to our discussion at the City Council Retreat regarding strategies for managing local offender populations in ways other than incarceration, I asked Andy Warriner, Director of the Hampton-Newport News Criminal Justice Agency, to provide an overview of the agency and highlight its primary functions.

In 1994, the Virginia General Assembly enacted legislation resulting in the creation of local Community Criminal Justice Boards, which are mandated by the Code of Virginia Section § 9.1-178. All localities in Virginia that have a Community-Based Corrections Program are required to have a Community Criminal Justice Board. The Board is made up of private citizens and key policy makers from the Cities of Hampton and Newport News and its criminal justice stakeholders. Moreover, the Board advises and assists local agencies in establishing or modifying services for both victims and offenders.

My objective is to use Andy's presentation as a springboard to explore any specific areas of interest that you may have about diverting young adults from the criminal justice system to alternative sentencing programs.
