

To prevent clutter and improve community aesthetics, the Newport News City Code contains regulations prohibiting temporary signage, flags, banners and similar displays. Newport News municipal code **Section 33.01-8, Prohibited Signs**, specifies:

(g) **Temporary signs**, except as exempted in section 33.01-7.(8), **including without limitation, flags, banners, pennants, festoons, and any other nonpermanent sign intended to call attention to, advertise or promote sales, special events, openings or similar events, shall be prohibited** on any premises beyond the exterior of any building(s).

Each year, the City expends significant resources enforcing temporary sign regulations and removing illegal signage from the public rights-of-way. You can help improve the appearance of our City by removing illegal temporary signage from the public right-of-way. The following pictures illustrate some of illegal signage picked up by City staff.



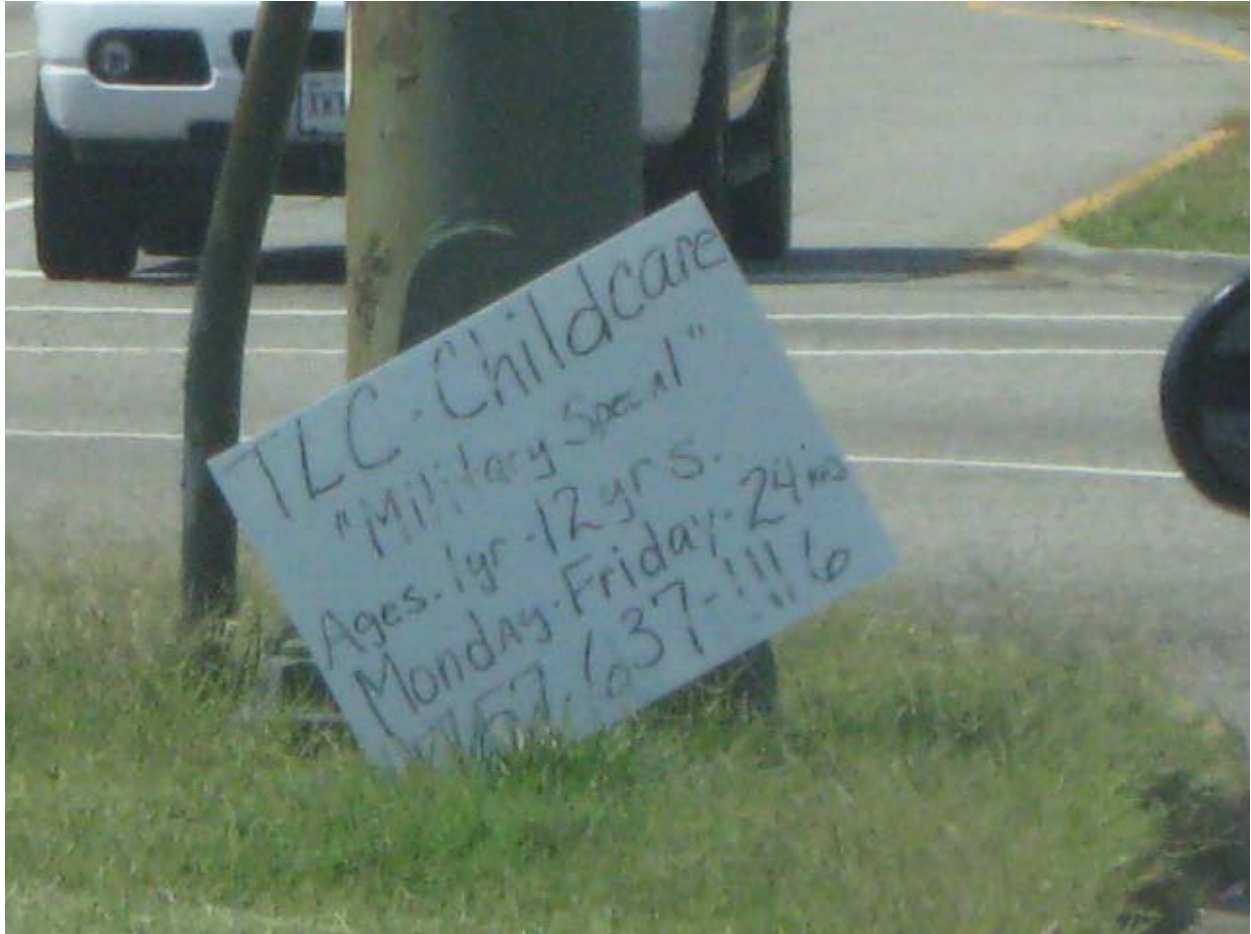
