IFB #2010-6570-1505 WALKERS DAM REHABILITATION PROJECT – PHASE II, CONTRACT NO. 83

Scope of Work: Without intending to limit or restrict the extent of work required under this contract, the work to be performed comprises the following:

Providing all labor, tools, materials, equipment and services as indicated on the drawings And in the IFB project manual as required for the rehabilitation of Walkers Dam, including

- Demolition of portions of the existing dam
- Construction of a new boat lock and new fish passage structure
- Sheet pile cutoff with concrete backfill on part of the dam and at both abutments
- H-pile and steel reinforcement for the dam
- Sheet pile with concrete backfill at debris removal area
- Installation of debris and security booms and navigation aids
- Installation of fencing, lighting, and security cameras
- All other items of work shown and specified in the Contract Documents

Each bid greater than \$100,000 shall be accompanied by a bidder's bond or certified check of five percent (5%) of the amount of the bid. A Performance and Labor & Material Payment Bond amounting to one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price will be required of the successful bidder.
