SCOPE OF WORK: – Provide all labor, material and equipment for the construction of a new 15,882 square feet one-story with partial mezzanine building, Fire Station No. 3 at 10454 Jefferson Avenue, Newport News, Virginia. The work includes in addition to architectural items, civil and site work, landscaping, plumbing, heating ventilating air-conditioning (HVAC), fire protection and electrical systems. Contractors shall comply with the provisions of the ARRA regulations. Contractor to take special consideration for compliance with the following requirement: (1)The standards identified in the Buy American Act, 41, U.S.G. §§ 10a-10d.:(2) The U. S. Department of Labor Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C.A. §§ 276a to 276a-5); (3) Completion of employment impact reports.

This contract consists of plans and technical specifications as amended by Special Conditions and Department of Engineering Standard Specifications. Plans and technical specifications for said contract may be obtained by bona fide contractors and suppliers at the Office of the Department of Engineering, 8th Floor, City Hall Building, Newport News, Virginia, telephone (757) 926-8611 for a non-refundable fee of 78.75 including tax per copy. If the contractor submitting a bid does not have a set of the current Department of Engineering Standard Specifications, a set shall be purchased prior to submitting a bid at a cost of \$15.75, including tax per copy, non-refundable and shall be maintained on the job site at all times until the completion of the project.

The City reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to award a contract in whole or in part, and to waive any informality in the procurement process. Bidders making errors may request withdrawal of their bids by giving written notice, including original work papers, within two business days after the bid opening.
