The History of the Project....

In the year 2000, the Newport News Police
Department approached the Citizen Police Academy
Alumni Association (CPAAA) about sponsoring a project
to open a community center where the public could
come and learn about the police department, community
policing opportunities, and other issues relating to citizen
and public safety. Out of this initial idea, the Community
Education and Outreach Center came into existence.

Members of the business community and individuals gave donations, materials and time to the project. Everything that you see before you—the facility, the furniture and the educational and historical information—is a result of volunteer efforts along with hard work by the members of the Newport News Police Department.

In 2005, the CE&OC moved from its original location in Patrick Henry Mall. In August of that year the center reopened in these historic buildings that once housed the Hilton Amoco Station.

In the fall of 2011 an ambitious renovation project was started to refurbish the museum area and create meeting space in the former "service" area. Through the efforts of numerous city departments and our dedicated volunteers the center re-opened in April of 2012. It now boasts a meeting area. It is also certified as a location for police training.
